What are cookies

As is common practice with all professional websites, this site uses cookies, tiny files downloaded to your computer to improve your experience. This page describes what information they gather, how we use it, and why we sometimes need to store these cookies. We will also share how you can prevent these cookies from being stored; however, this may downgrade or 'break' certain elements of the site's functionality.

How we use cookies

We use cookies for the various reasons detailed below. Unfortunately, in most cases, there are no industry-standard options for turning off cookies without completely disabling the functionality and features they add to this site. It is recommended that you leave all cookies on if you are unsure whether you need them, primarily if they are used to provide a service you use.

Disabling cookies

You can prevent the setting of cookies by adjusting the settings on your browser (see your browser Help for how to do this). Be aware that disabling cookies will affect the functionality of this and many other websites that you visit. Disabling cookies usually also turns off certain functionality and features of this site. Therefore, it is recommended that you do not disable cookies.

The cookies we set

Account related cookies

If you create an account with us, we will use cookies to manage the signup process and general administration. These cookies will usually be deleted when you log out; however, in some cases, they may remain afterward to remember your site preferences when you log out.

Login related cookies

We use cookies when you are logged in to remember this fact. This prevents you from having to log in every time you visit a new page. These cookies are typically removed or cleared when you log out to ensure that you can only access restricted features and areas when logged in.

Forms related cookies

When you submit data through a form such as those found on contact pages or comment forms, cookies may be set to remember your user details for future correspondence.

Site preferences cookies

We provide the functionality to set your preferences for how this site runs when you use it, ensuring a great experience. To remember your preferences, we need to set cookies so that this information can be called whenever you interact with a page affected by your preferences.

Third-party cookies

In some exceptional cases, we also use cookies provided by trusted third parties—the following section details which third-party cookies you might encounter on this site.

- This site uses Google Analytics, one of the most widespread and trusted analytics solutions on the web, to help us understand how you use the site and how we can improve your experience. These cookies may track how long you spend on the site and the pages you visit so we can continue producing engaging content. - As we sell products, we need to understand statistics about how many of the visitors to our site make a purchase, and as such, this is the kind of data that these cookies will track. This is important to you as it means we can accurately make business predictions to monitor our advertising and product costs to ensure the best possible price.
